BATTLEFIELDS HISTORY TRIP

The trip to the Battlefields was a great success. The trip involved a wide array of activities and visits to the memorials, museums and cemeteries.

On the first day we visited Lijssenhoek cemetery, seeing the graves of soldiers from across the world. We also had a chance to explore a German trench system, exploring how they Germans we able to take advantage of the high ground above Ypres. After dinner we stopped off at the Menin Gate in Ypres to attend the 8pm last post ceremony. We had the chance to lay a wreath down during the service, it was a truly moving experience.

We visited the South African and Canadian memorials as well as the Somme battlefields. We ended our day in France at the Thiepval memorial, where the names of over 50,000 soldiers with no

know grave are recorded. On the last day we went to a museum in Passchendaele and visited the Tyne Cot cemetery which is the largest World War One cemetery on the planet with 44,000 soldiers buried there

To conclude I think that everyone involved with this trip would agree that it was an amazing experience.
