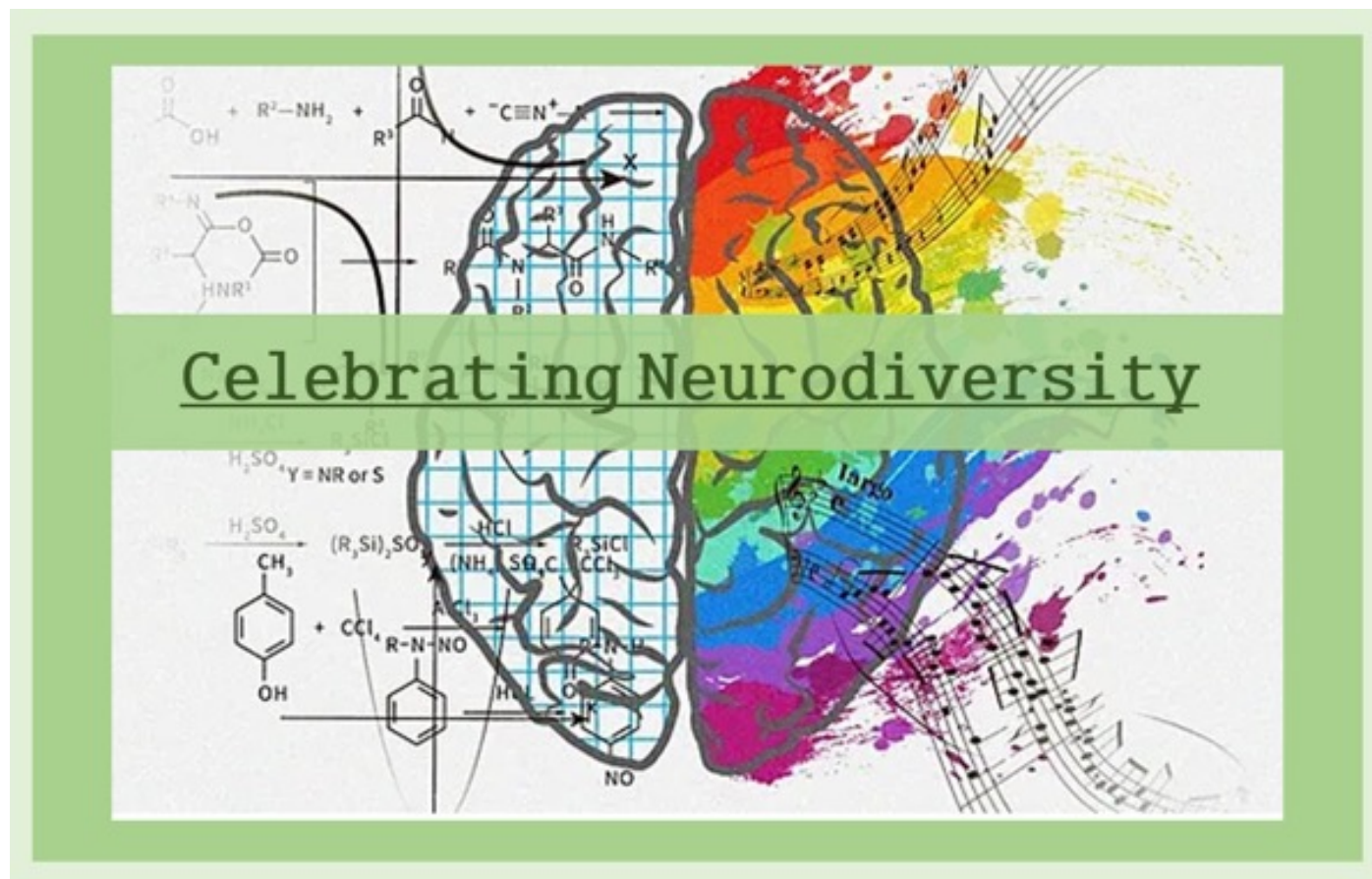


CELEBRATING NEURODIVERSITY
