

"Recently 30 students travelled to Paris to complete their French exchange with the Collège Notre Dame de Bury. The students spent a week immersed in French culture and life while staying with their various host families in the area. On Friday, English students visited the Palace of Versailles. We received a tour of the Palace, learning about its historical importance, and a chance to explore the large gardens. The weekend was spent with exchange families, with many students touring Paris and visiting landmarks such as the Arc de Triomphe, Gallérie de LaFayette, the Champs Elysees and the Louvre. On Monday, all students travelled into the centre of Paris by the metro. Firstly, we had the chance to go up the Eiffel Tower and have a fabulous view of the city. Then we took a sunning trip around Paris by boat on the Seine. We saw the Notre Dame, famous bridges and the Musee d'Orsay. The weather was perfect, very warm with lots of sun. After the boat tour we took the metro to Montmartre where we had time to explore the area around the Sacre Coeur. On Tuesday and Wednesday morning, the English students were immersed into a French school day, participating in various lessons with other French students. On Wednesday, the French students provided a delicious picnic for everybody which was thoroughly enjoyed before the English students departed for the Gare du Nord in the evening Overall, the trip was an excellent experience, and we all look forward to the second leg of the exchange in July when the French students visit Oakham."
