We were delighted to be able to hold our annual Christmas Concert at All Saints' Church, performances from students in Catmose College and Harington, a drama sketch and beautiful readings.










Tasks included hands-on activities like a land rover wheel change race and setting up a 12v lighting system. At 71 Squadron, avionics engineers shared insights into the RAF Astra programme and demonstrated ultrasound and echo location for aircraft safety. The day concluded with a visit to the Heritage Centre, offering a glimpse into Harrier jet development. SUPPORT STAFF


