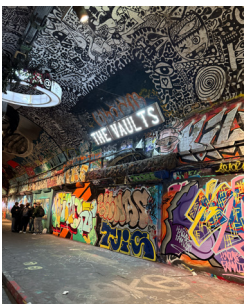


## YEAR 11 ART RESIDENTIAL

A big thank-you to everyone involved in making this experience possible!







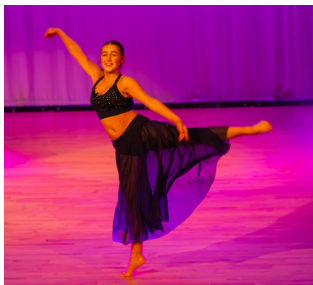
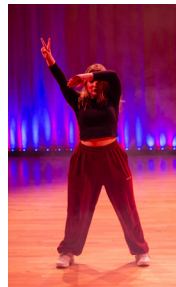
## YEAR 7 HERCULES TRIP
